- 1. Listen and take others seriously
- 2. Avoid falsely representing the other side
- 3. Resist assuming motive
- 4. When you can, find points of agreement to affirm
- 5. Resist focusing on the periphery
- 6. Avoid being unnecessarily antagonistic
- 7. The cross is offensive so don't be personally offensive
