Transitions Proverbs 16:1-3

1. Describe the time you transitioned to the Village.
2. Read Proverbs 16:1
Part of planning is understanding yourself - Describe your plans and yourself with the grid: Comfort zone vs. Gift zone vs. Danger zone as talked about in the sermon.
3. Only one plan will ultimately be carried out: God's. Describe a time where God reworked your plans?
4. Do you have a hard time resting in God's sovereignty when your dreams, plans and transitions don't seem to go anywhere?
5. Read Proverbs 16:2 and Psalm 139:23-24.
Do you let God examine your motives in your planning?
6. Is there a plan or transition in your life that you need to slow down? Is there one you need to speed up?
7. Read Proverbs 16:3
What plan, relationship or transition do you need to commit to the Lord?
8. Talk about and rejoice in the transition of Jesus from glory to Take on flesh and die for sinners and Transition in resurrection from the dead ... If God accomplished the transitions in the Gospel for your salvation then don't you think He will work for your good and His glory in your future transitions?
9. Why do our futures tend to be exposed slowly like a Polaroid picture? Describe your daily dependence on the Lord in the face of the unknown.
